6:42pm Chair Report

Vanessa welcomed everyone back.

<u>Food Sharing Project</u> - LDSB supplies food for students in the cafeteria for free. Between September 1 2022 and March 31 2023 SHS used ~\$14k in funding to run the food sharing project. \$630000 was used board-wide for the same period

The board has asked for ways to reduce our budgets. With that in mind, some more expensive foods are no longer orderable. The Hospitality and Tourism program manages the intake of delivered bulk food and prepares it. Kathy noted that if anyone has connections, trades unions have a history of donating money to programs like this.

PIC - Parent Involvement Committee is a committee of all the chairs from all the schools in the board. They meet regularly at the board office. The Director and Trustees are also involved, but the committee is run by parents. Vanessa is this year's co-chair of the PIC.

Since she is co-chair, Vanessa asked for a volunteer to represent SHS SAC. October 5th is the first meeting. Kathy said she would, however, she will be unavailable for the first few months. Vanessa noted that there are five to six meetings per year.

Vanessa noted that there is a facebook PIC group

Vanessa has attended, with PIC, the provincial educator ministry meeting (all of Ontario). She said Mental health is a big topic for those meetings. There are 2 meetings per year

Pro Funding Grant. We can apply for the grant which is ~\$1000-\$1500. Pro grants can be put towards speakers or workshops

Kathy talked about the Human Trafficking workshop put on by LDSB given by Kelly Beale
