## 6:34pm Parent Involvement Committee (PIC) report - Vanessa

- At the last <u>PIC</u> meeting the <u>Kingston Police</u> hosted a Hate Crime Prevention workshop. Unfortunately there were only three members who attended that meeting, so they're running it again at the next PIC meeting.
- A topic that arose was discussing changing the name of the committee to something more inclusive.
- Another issue that arose was applications for <u>Parents Reaching Out (PRO) Grants</u>
  - Vanessa noted that closing dates for PRO Grant applications are mid March and asked the School Council if anyone had ideas about what we could apply for?
  - Some ideas that were floated:
    - SHSM workshops
    - Financial literacy workshops
      - Roxanne noted that students are often directed to Julia at the Learning Centre
      - KEYS was also mentioned as a resource
    - In the past some elementary schools have sent home literacy packages
    - Sexual Health and how it's be influenced by the COVID pandemic
  - In brainstorming ideas Roxanne said that the Grade 8 open house last spring worked really well because it was formatted as a flexible "drop in" type of event (4:00pm-7:00pm)
  - Roxanne also noted that <u>SALT</u> presentations are well publicised
